

# HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

## WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

### (FOOTPATH AE101 MANCETTER) PUBLIC PATH EXTINGUISHMENT ORDER 2006

### (FOOTPATH AE215 MANCETTER AND HARTSHILL) PUBLIC PATH CREATION ORDER 2006

#### 1. EXTINGUISHMENT ORDER

On 11 October 2006, Warwickshire County Council confirmed the above order made under section 118 of the Highways Act 1980. The effect of the order as confirmed will extinguish public footpath AE101 from Point B approximately 58 metres north west of Hartshill Wharf, Hartshill, running generally west north west for approximately 280 metres to Point A approximately 328 metres west north west of Hartshill Wharf, Hartshill, as shown on the order map.

#### 2. CREATION ORDER

On 11 October 2006, Warwickshire County Council confirmed the above order made under section 26 of the Highways Act 1980, the effect of the order as confirmed will create public footpath AE215 from Point D approximately 20 metres north east of Hartshill Wharf, Hartshill running generally north west for approximately 40 metres, then generally south south east for approximately 20 metres, then generally west north west for approximately 340 metres to Point C, approximately 336 metres west north west of Hartshill Wharf, Hartshill, as shown on the order map. The new route shall have a width of 2 metres.

A copy of the order and the order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the offices of Warwickshire County Council, Countryside Recreation, Unit 11 Montague Road, Warwick from 9.00am to 5.30pm on weekdays (5.00pm Fridays). Copies of the order and map may be bought there at the price of £5. Copies may also be inspected at the offices of North Warwickshire Borough Council, The Council House, South Street, Atherstone, CV9 1BD between 8.50am and 5.15pm weekdays, at Atherstone Library and at [www.warwickshire.gov.uk/pathorders](http://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/pathorders)

The order comes into force on 11 October 2006, but if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 11 October 2006 make an application to the High Court.
